Reading, writing, ordering and comparing numbers to 10,000,000 and determining value of digits; Counting forwards and backwards in steps of powers of ten; Rounding whole numbers to any degree of accuracy (10, 100, 1000, 10,000 and 100,000); Using negative numbers in context, and calculating intervals across zero; Calculation methods for all four operations, including long multiplication and long division; Multiples, factors, common factors, composite numbers and prime numbers up to 100; Addition, subtraction, multiplication and division of fractions; Comparing and ordering fractions, decimals and percentages, including those >1.

What you can could do to help:

Practise times tables regularly.

Practise powers of 10 and multiplying by 10, 100 and 1000.

As well as practising calculations regularly using formal written methods, also practise answering calculations mentally.

What you can could do to help:

Practise memorising and using grammatical terms.

Read a variety of books and texts regularly.

Discuss what your child is reading to ensure they have understood the text.
