

<p>Maths Count objects to 100 and read and write numbers in numerals and words. Represent numbers using pictures and the part whole model. Compare and order objects and numbers. Count in steps of 2, 3, 5 and 10. Recall and learn addition facts to 20. Add and subtract numbers using a range of methods. Solve problems using addition and subtraction. Recognise and use symbols for pounds and pence. Find different combinations of coins that equal the same amount of money. Solve simple money problems – working out how to give change. Recall and use multiplication and division facts for the 2, 5 and 10 times table. Solve multiplication and division problems using the correct signs.</p>	<p>English Plan and write an entertaining story. Use a range of new vocabulary. Write non-narrative text types. Continue to use the say it, write it, check it process when writing. To spell high frequency words (tricky words). To apply segmenting skills to support spelling. To investigate and learn new spelling patterns. Form lower case letters and capital letters correctly ensuring they are the correct size. Add detail to talk and listen carefully. Maintain focus during a group discussion and ask relevant questions. To continue to use phonic knowledge to read accurately. Recognise alternative sounds for graphemes. Read and remember tricky words. Self-correct when reading aloud. Listen to and discuss a wide range of poems, stories and non-fiction texts. Show an understanding of books through discussion and opinion. Discuss the meaning of new and favourite words.</p>	
<p>What you can could do to help: Practise the recall of addition and subtraction facts to 20. Make up addition and subtraction problems at home and use counting objects and pictures to solve them.</p>	<p>What you can could do to help: Read regularly with your child and talk about what they have read. Practice reading and spelling common sight words and tricky words. Practice extending simple sentences using joining words such as <i>'and, but, so and because'</i>.</p>
