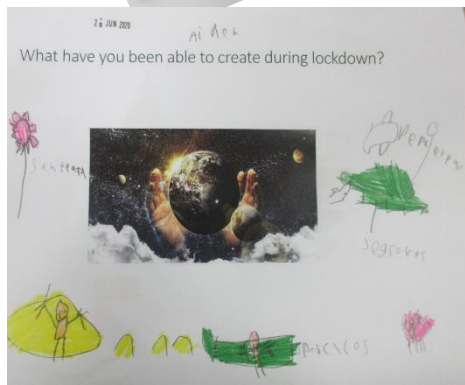
The Big Question for this week – What have I created during lockdown?

The children in the KS1 Key Worker group came up with these answers to this week's Big Question.

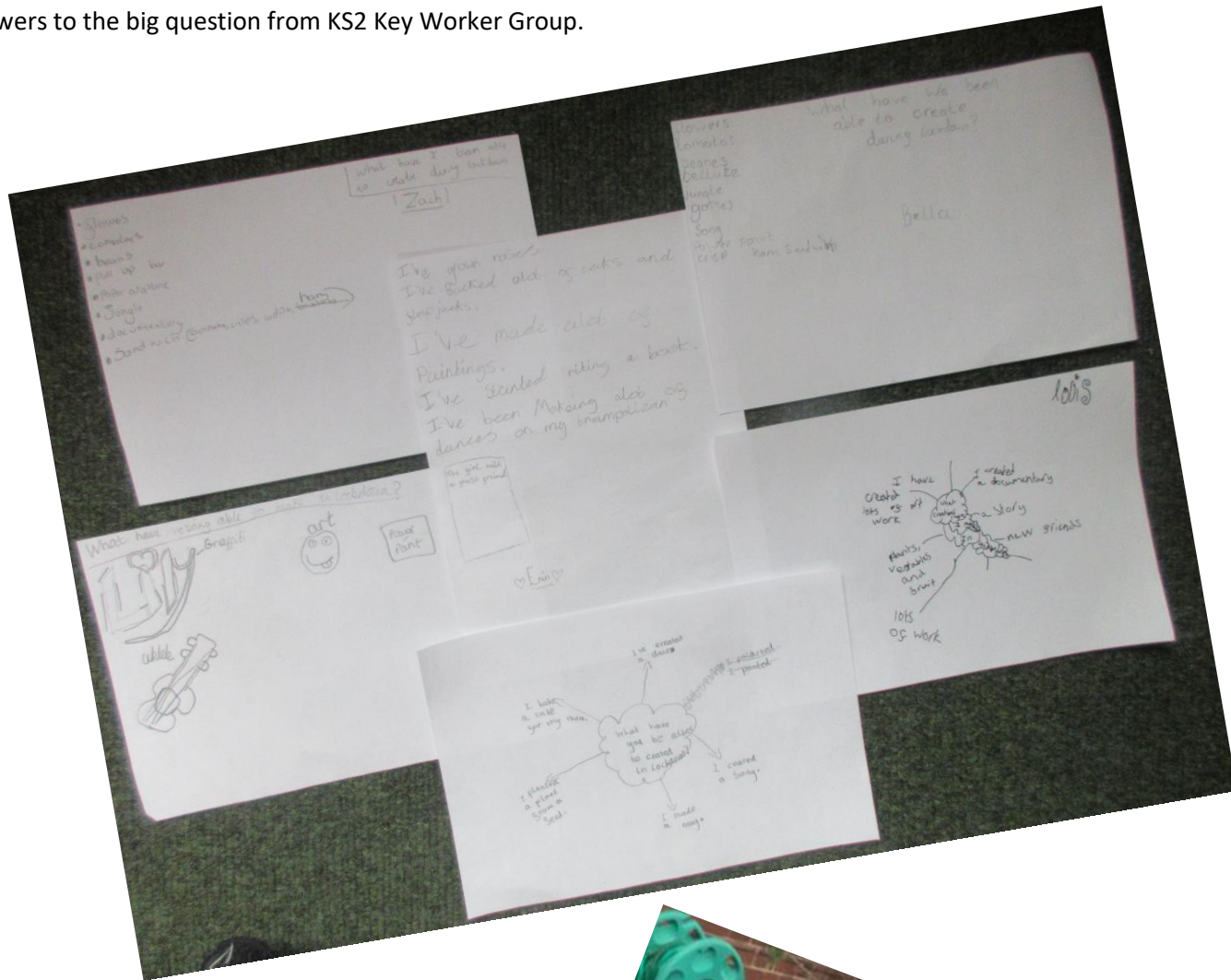
What have you been able to create during Lockdown?

<p>How to make an Egyptian Mummy.</p>  <p><i>By Freya Gayler</i></p>	<p>WHAT YOU NEED</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A dead body • Water from the Nile • 375 m linen • One knife • Resin • Fake eyes and hair • Makeup • Palm oil • Natron • One hook • Canopic jars • Amulets 	
 <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. First you will need to wash the body in palm oil and water from the Nile. 2. Then pull out the brain through the nostrils using the hook. 3. Cut out the stomach, heart, liver, lungs and intestines using a knife and put them in the correct Canopic jars. 	 <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 4. Now you need to leave the body to dry in Natron for around 40-45 days. 5. Once the body has dried stuff the inside with linen. 6. Now apply fake eyes, hair and makeup to make the mummy look pretty. 	 <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 7. Wrap the mummy in linen from the head all the way down to the toes. Place the Amulets into the wrappings as you go along. Then place a book of the dead papyrus roll in the mummy's hand. 	 <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 8. Finally wrap the mummy in one piece of cloth and then you have finished.

Aneka has drawn an excellent portrait of Queen Victoria and I am so impressed with how regal she has made her look. Miss Smith

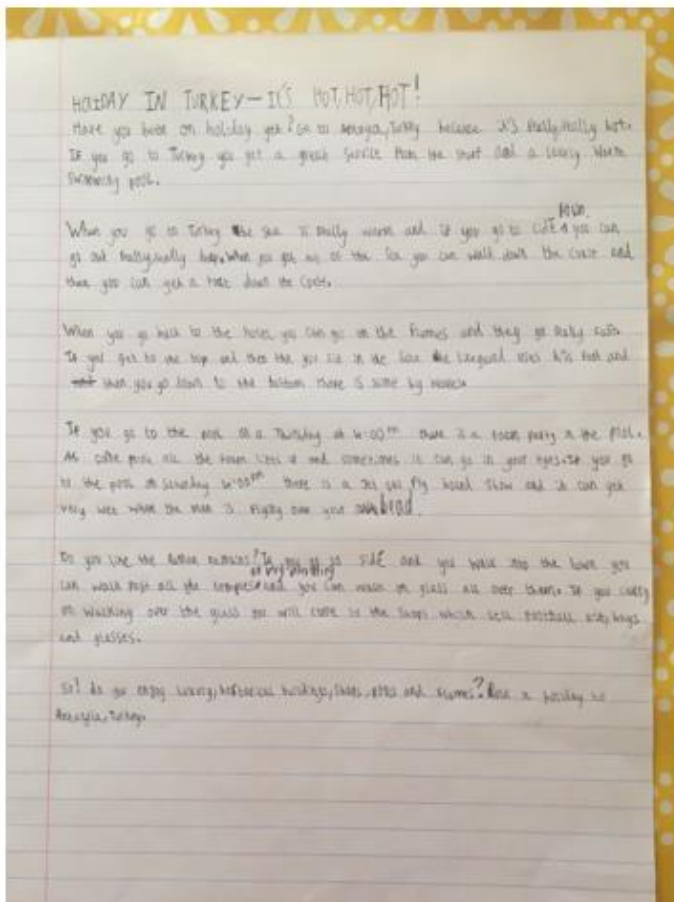


This week we have chosen two boys from Maple Class who have both been working really hard at home.
