


<p>Maths To start the term, we will be focussing on place value and securing our knowledge of numbers from 0 - 100. Children will be learning to recognise numbers to 100 and read and write these in numerals and words. They will also learn to compare and order numbers using mathematical vocabulary to support their reasoning about number.</p> <p>Also, the children will be recapping number bonds to 10 and learning their number bonds to 20 and identifying the relationship between these and number bonds to 100. They will be finding ten more and less of a given number and learning to add and subtract two two-digit numbers together.</p> <p>In the later part of the term, the children will learn about money by learning to recognise coins and their values, adding money to make simple amounts and recognising different ways to make the same total.</p> <p>We will also begin a multiplication topic that explores the link between repeated addition and the use of the multiplication symbol.</p>	<p>English In Autumn 1, our topic is the Great Fire of London. We will be learning about the fire and writing about the events that happened. We will also explore key individuals from this period and write about their lives; including how and why they were important to the events of the fire.</p> <p>In Autumn 2, our topic is Space. We will be reading a range of non-fiction texts to develop our understanding of the Solar System and to learn more specifically about the planets. We will also look at important individuals such as Neil Armstrong.</p>
