This week Sycamore have been designing and setting up a science investigation about growing seeds.

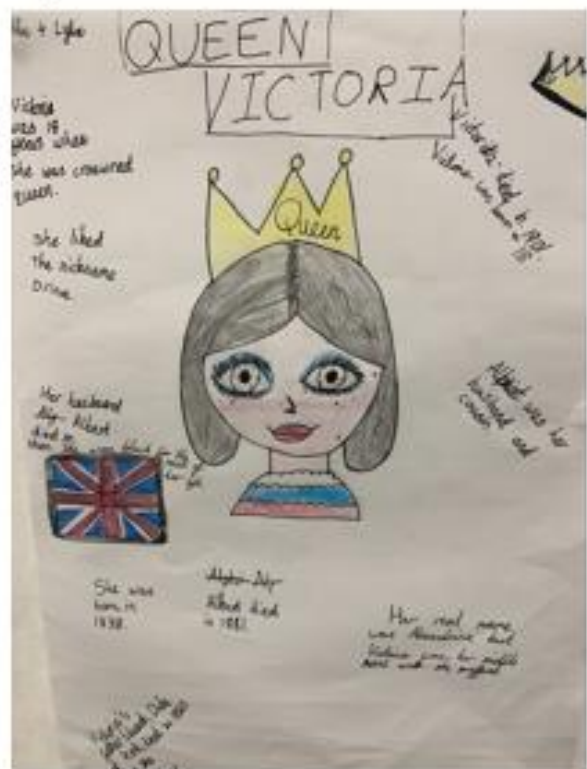
We have also been learning about ancient Greek pottery and designing our own Greek vases.

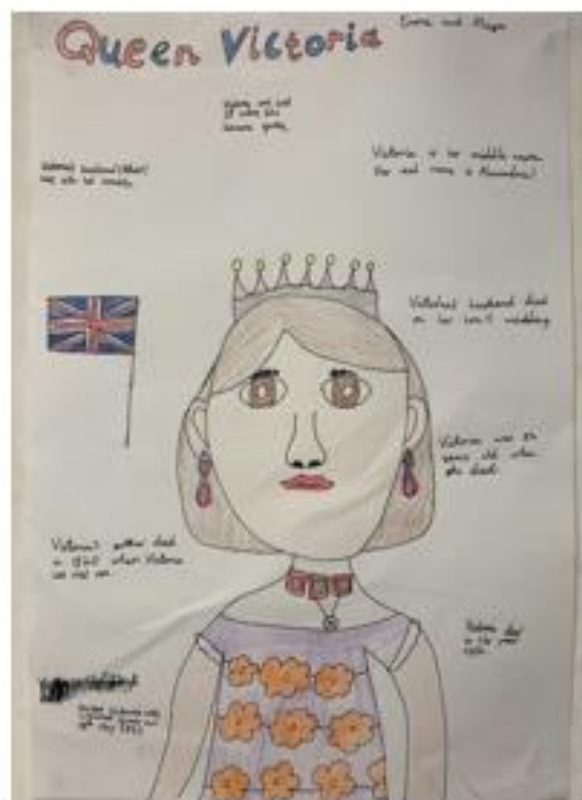
