In Class we have been writing our own | poetry and sharing our poems with the class.



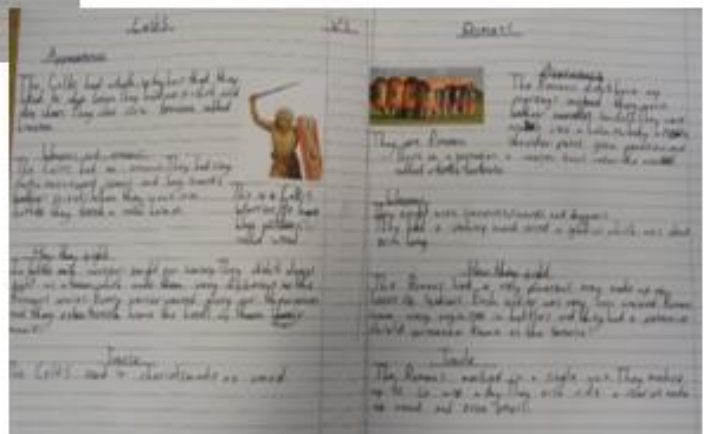
This Week in Oak B!
