

<p>Maths To start the term, we will be continuing our fractions work, finding fractions of amounts as well as adding and subtracting fractions. We will move onto learning about decimals, recognising tenths and hundredths as decimals and placing decimal numbers on a place value grid and number line. We will compare and order decimals, as well as rounding them to the nearest whole number. In the later part of the term, we will be focussing on telling the time to the nearest minute, as well as introducing digital times for the 12 hour and 24-hour clock. The children will also be solving problems involving time. We will also complete work on shape. We will identify types of angles, comparing and ordering them as well as identifying and exploring different types of triangles.</p>	<p>English To start the term, we will be focusing on story writing and spelling, punctuation and grammar features that will help with this, such as correctly using punctuation for speech and interesting and varied sentences starters and structures. We will be beginning a new class book, which links with our Ancient Egypt topic for this term, and this will give us some writing inspiration as well as provide with lots of opportunities to explore different comprehension skills. Other text types we will be exploring this term include persuasive writing, newspaper reports and explanation texts.</p>

<p>Science: In Science, we will be learning about our digestive system and the different types of teeth we have. We will also construct and interpret a variety of food chains, identifying producers, predators and prey. As part of our work on living things we will explore and use classification keys to help group, identify and name a variety of living things in their local and wider environment. <p>Computing</p> <p>In this term we will continue to work on our typing fluency using BBC Dance Mat and Purple Mash.</p> <p>We will also be using 2Code and Scratch to explore coding. The children will learn how to read and create algorithms to achieve specific tasks and how to debug programmes to find and correct errors.</p>		<p>Art/DT</p> <p>In Art, the children will be developing their observational drawing skills, their understanding of works by other artists and exploring printing techniques.</p> <p>In DT, the children will continue to develop their research, design, making and evaluating skills and knowledge through cooking and textile projects.</p>
<p>RE In first part of the term we will be learning about the Hindu faith. We will explore the different ways in which Hindu's show and express their faith. In the second half of the term we will be exploring how and why people mark the significant events of life. We will explore what happens at ceremonies of commitment such as baptism, marriage and sacred thread and what these rituals mean.</p>	<p>History In History, we will be learning lots of exciting things about Ancient Egypt, including the importance of the River Nile, gods and goddesses, pharaohs, tomb treasures, pyramids and mummification. This topic will give us lots of inspiration for lots of Art, DT and creative writing.</p>	<p>PSHE The children will be focusing on how we stay healthy and look after ourselves, exploring what a healthy lifestyle is. We will also look at equality and diversity, exploring different beliefs people may have and looking at how we can respect each other's differences. In the later part of the term we will look at financial capability, exploring the value of money and its uses. We will also continue to look at current events and how they impact our thoughts and feelings. As part of our Sex and relationships education we will explore what happens to our body when we reach puberty and how males and females are different. We will also explore what it means to be grown up and how responsibilities change.</p>
