Governor monitoring

Governors are still unable to come into school but continue to monitor virtually as much as we can, including termly committee meetings for:

- Teaching, Learning and Achievement
- Resources
- RE and Worship

New to the termly newsletter, governors would like to share information from governor committees with parents and carers to keep you up to date with the monitoring taking place.

Teaching, Learning and Achievement

When we met this term, children had been back in school for four weeks, during which time the focus had been on settling into a more normal start to the school year following a year of disrupted learning.

Governors heard updates from, and were able to put questions to, the English, maths and RE subject leads about children's progress in these core subjects.

Governors noted that staff had been assessing where children were at, identifying gaps and putting appropriate strategies in place to support the children's learning for the coming year.

Subject leads gave positive reports, not only about the overall achievements of the children, but about how well they had adjusted to being back in school and were responding to their learning.

Governors heard how there is a high profile of reading within school and particularly of nurturing a genuine love of reading with regular opportunities for children to develop their independent reading as well as teachers being encouraged to read *to* the children too —at least weekly and daily where they can. There has also been a big focus on writing across the school, with younger children building their stamina for writing and older children expanding and developing their writing skills.

In RE, all the children continue to have the opportunity to reflect on The Big Question, in the same way they did under Covid restrictions, which was one of the things that worked well and the school has decided to keep as it gives everyone the opportunity to reflect.

Each class also has the school's 'vision' displayed and the children are encouraged to look for examples of the vision being lived out each day. This is acknowledged and praised by staff.

Following on from the success of both the Christmas and Easter focus days, the school will also now be celebrating Hanukkah and Diwali.
